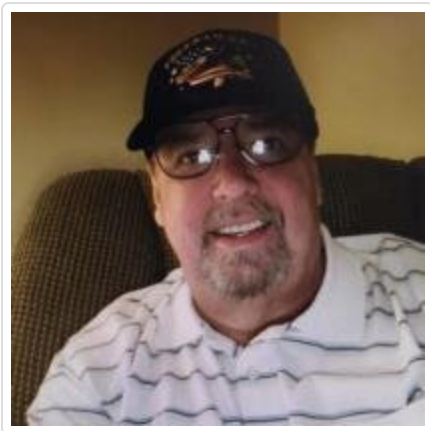




## Dan Jerome Robbins
