Later, around 1978-79, when Ed was a Montgomery County Deputy we played basketball together along with Bruce Huggins and Andy Hardin. It is funny to see Ed remembered as "Big Ed," because he always referred to me as "Big Pur" (I was 3-4 inches taller than he). I remember Ed as not being the most graceful athlete. His movements were a little wooden (perfect for the guard and tackle he was in football). He could hit a baseball a mile, but his swings were often late and the balls he hit were usually on the wrong side of the right field foul line. He took up a great deal of space on the basketball court (and set many a solid screen for Andy Hardin), but he did not have great leaping ability. Whatever grace Ed lacked as a athlete, however, he made up for as a human being. He was everybody's friend. The Litaker home, as modest as it was, was a home to all his friends. Ed's mother was also our mother. Ed showed little ego and dealt well with those who had too much ego. Ed was calm and steady and dealt well with those of us who were more volatile. It is no wonder that he lived his life as a public servant in so many important roles. I got to have lunch with Andy Hardin a couple of months ago and he told me all about the life accomplishments of our dear friend. I wish I could have told Ed personally, but this will have to suffice. Ed, I am so proud of the man you became.
